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

Tunis, between history and modernity

A flourishing modern metropolis and major historic city, Tunis never ceases to surprise.

In the medina, numerous ancient buildings open their doors, some transformed into museums or cultural centres, others into restaurants and tea rooms.

Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site, the medina is a treasure trove. From its gates, stretch out picturesque quarters with beautiful façades from the 1900s. Whilst on the outskirts, trendy restaurants and entertainment venues rub shoulders in the modern quarters.

MEDINA AND ART DECO BUILDINGS

The old quarter of Tunis, the medina, is in an outstanding state of preservation. The souks, covered with arches let in a dim light, are teeming and overflowing with goods of all kind: fabrics of a thousand colours, perfumes or precious jewels. The contrast with the peaceful neighbouring alleys is striking. White walls and blue ironwork, vaulted passageways, domes with green tiles, yellow doors framed with delicate patterns in carved stone... Taking the time to stroll is crucial to fully appreciate the diversity of the medina.

On the modern side, the neighbourhoods surrounding Bourguiba avenue have their own special charm. At the foot of the buildings in an Art Nouveau and Art Deco style, a lively crowd squeezes into popular cafes, fashion boutiques, tramways and rows of palm and fig trees.

Sip on a drink on a terrace admiring the carved façade of the Municipal Theatre, inaugurated in 1902, and the statue of Ibn Khaldoun, eminent scholar born in Tunis in the 14th century.

CULTURE AND TRENDY PARTIES

In the medina of Tunis, you can visit remarkable monuments, see a photography exhibition in the Kheireddine Palace, listen to a concert of Arab-Andalusian music in a former madrasah or attend the biennial contemporary art event Dream City. In the city centre, visit the cathedral in the Byzantine-Moorish style, always full of activity. Hear a classical music concert in the Municipal Theatre, built in 1902, or take a stroll in Belvedere Park. History buffs can visit the archaeological site of Oudhna, located 25 km away. And not far from Tunis, you can enjoy all the attractions of the Coasts of Carthage.

CARTHAGE AND SIDI BOU SAID

Close to the city centre, a stunning location and striking views: this is the introduction to the Coasts of Carthage, named after one of the most glorious ancient cities of the Mediterranean. Founded by the Phoenicians, destroyed then rebuilt by the Romans, Carthage is now a fashionable city. Next door, Sidi Bou Said is an elegant village where the blue and white houses cluster on the hillside, facing the sea. The beaches of Gammarth and La Marsa are within easy reach of these spectacular locations.

THE BARDO MUSEUM

The most extensive and impressive mosaic exhibition in the world can be found in Tunis, in the former palace of the Beys, the Bardo Museum, which was entirely renovated and enlarged in 2012. The museum possesses a unique collection of Roman artefacts, as well as objects from Tunisia's entire history, from ancient Carthage to the Ottoman period.
